Environmental Programs and Awards Garnered by PIER 39

PIER 39 is committed to the preservation and conservation of the San Francisco Bay's natural environment by encouraging, creating and supporting ecological education, responsible consumption, development of renewable energy sources and addressing environmental issues. In 2009, PIER 39's recycling efforts helped divert more than three million pounds of waste material from local landfills. Along with cardboard, mixed paper, plastic, glass and aluminum, PIER 39 offers an organic/wet garbage composting program for its full-service restaurants. One million pounds of organic material from the restaurants were composted in the program's first year. PIER 39 recycles 100 percent of its landscaping waste – 57,000 pounds annually – and 1 million pounds of food waste.

A portion of this recycled waste is returned as fully composted material and incorporated back into the soil. The PIER 39 Marina is also the first marina to run its patrol boats on pure soy diesel.

In recognition for its outstanding, wide-range recycling efforts, PIER 39 has received numerous awards, including the State of California's Waste Reduction Program (WRAP) Award almost every year since. Locally, PIER 39 was recognized by Building Owners and Managers Association (BOMA), S.F. Department of the Environment and Golden Gate Disposal as the "Most Improved Recycler of the Year" in the 2007 Commercial Recycler of the Year (CORY) award contest.

Splashy Sea Lions

California sea lions began hauling out on PIER 39's K-Dock shortly after the 1989 San Francisco earthquake. The boisterous barking pinnipeds started arriving in droves, taking over the docks. At first they numbered from 10-50 but due to a plentiful herring supply, the available dock space and a protective environment, the population grew to more than 300 with a couple of months.

Last year and the beginning of 2010 has been an incredible time at PIER 39 with California sea lions both arriving and leaving K-Dock in record numbers. Why so many descended on the PIER in September of 2009 – some 1,701 to be exact – and why so many left all at once, is a mystery, but may certainly have something to do with shifting food sources in the San Francisco Bay and beyond. As of February 2010 PIER 39 has an estimated 50 sea lions on K-Dock. We expect them to return very soon.

The Marine Mammal Center, an organization devoted to the rescue and rehabilitation of marine mammals, as well as to the study of these animals' health, partners with PIER 39 to monitor the sea lion population.

Historical Milestones

August, 1977 - PIER 39 breaks ground. Authentic 1910 wood from Piers 34 and 3 are used to erect the new structure.

October 4, 1978 - PIER 39 opens on schedule to fanfare in San Francisco. Originally, PIER 39 had 23 restaurants, 50 stores, a diving pool and street performers.

August, 1981 - Moor + South acquires property, forming the PIER 39 Limited Partnership.

May, 1983 - Diving pool removed from PIER 39, Venetian Carousel moved from inside the Palace of Fun Arts to where it presently exists close to the Bay end of PIER 39.

January, 1989 - PIER 39 is named the third most-visited attraction in the country by USA Today.

January, 1990 - California sea lions begin arriving in droves on PIER 39's K Dock, creating a local and international sensation. To date, the population has grown as high as 1,701.

August, 1992 - Turbo Ride Simulation Theatre opens its doors.

April, 1996 - Underwater World now Aquarium of the Bay opens to the public..

July, 1998 - PIER 39 "Best Place to People Watch (San Francisco)" and "Best Video Games Arcade" as voted by the San Francisco Chronicle's Readers' Choice competition.

February, 1999 - Forbes Island, the world's only man-made, floating island opens in PIER 39's West Marina.

July, 1999 - PIER 39 "Best Place to People Watch (San Francisco)" as voted by the San Francisco Chronicle's Readers' Choice competition.

May, 2002 - Riptide Arcade family entertainment center opens with more than 100 video games, virtual reality units, novelty and prize redemption games.

August, 2002 - Hard Rock Cafe opens.

October, 2003 - PIER 39 celebrates its 25th anniversary on San Francisco's historic waterfront.

April, 2005 - Theatre 39 begins featuring live theatrical performances.

May, 2007 – Fog Harbor Fish House opens.

December, 2008 – Arrival of the new, two-story San Francisco Carousel hand-crafted in Italy with renderings of its home city.

May, 2009 - Blue and Gold Fleet officially debuts RocketBoat, the all new thrill ride on San Francisco Bay (seasonal May-October).

July, 2009 - Riptide Arcade is remodeled into Players Arcade & Sports Grill.

October, 2009 - Magowan's Infinite Mirror Maze opens.

November, 2009 - 1,701 Sea Lions haul out on PIER 39's K-Dock. Six new floats are added to accommodate the sudden influx of marine mammals.

January, 2010 - Aquarium of the Bay obtains non-profit status after it is acquired by The Bay Institute.
